Plans okayed for 'Bio-Social Colony'

The schematic phase of the biosocial colony facility planned for the University was accepted Thursday by the Campus Planning committee.

The colony is funded under a National Science Foundation supplementary science development grant. Budget for the facility is \$246,000, of which \$210,000 is for direct construction





Outlining the purpose of the facility, John Fentress, assistant professor of psychology and biology and director of the new project, said it could better be described as an animal behavior research center that would be non-departmental in nature.

The site and facility development were explained by the architects, Zaik-Miller of Portland, who noted that the site would consist of a two and onehalf acre fenced area on the east edge of the Foster-Silva property north of the Millrace.

The facility will include a three-part stucco-finished building complex of some 3,853 square feet, plus several fencedin animal runs.

The facility will leave the Millrace as unencumbered as possible. A buffer zone of 50 to 70 feet will separate the Millrace from the 6-foot outside fence of the facility.

Approval of the site for the biosocial colony was given by the Eugene Planning Committee on November 4. The appointment of Christopher Alexander of Berkeley, California, as long-range campus planning con-sultant for the University was also announced at the meeting.

Alexander, a well-known planner, is with the Center for Environmental Structures, a nonprofit organization in Berkeley. He also teaches part time at the University of California. He will begin his consulting services Jan.

In other action taken by the committee Thursday, a four-part motion concerning a proposed married student housing development was approved.

A recommendation from a sub-

committee on the project, was that a part of the so-called Sand and Gravel property, on the northwest campus between the railroad and the river, be ap-proved as a site for 160 mobile units for married housing and that an architect be assigned to make a study.

Prior to the motion, several members of the committee voiced objection to the site on the

grounds that it presented problems in terms of cost to the users, both in time and cash because of the need for transportation for accessibility to services.


